Invitation for Expression of Interest:

Research Assignment "Assessment of the impact of aerosols on climate with a combination of radiative transfer models and remote sensing"

The Institute of Chemical Engineering Sciences, Foundation of Research and Technology - Hellas, (FORTH/ICE-HT) is seeking applicants for one research assignment in the context of the research project "Next Generation Earth System Modelling for Realistic Projections of Rapid Climate Evolution in the Coming Decades" (RealESM) GA- 101293649 — HORIZON-CL5-2025-06" which is under the EU-Horizon Europe Research and Innovation Action (2021-2027).

Job Description

To conduct research under a work assignment or fixed-term employment contract in the framework of the aforementioned project "RealESM". The aim of the Horizon Europe funded RealESM project is to advance European capability for Earth System Modelling, underpin long-term science, and contribute to the global effort to reduce the consequences of climate change. The overall objective of RealESM is to enhance our ability to anticipate global and regional climate conditions and extreme events in the coming years and decades, by realistically and efficiently simulating atmospheric and ocean processes, and their interactions, under anthropogenic and natural forcing. RealESM will deliver (i) advances in process representation in Earth System Models at varying resolutions, (ii) step changes in model capabilities to efficiently simulate and project global and regional climate change on decadal scales, (iii) detailed quantification of physical hazards in the atmosphere and ocean, and the role of atmosphere-ocean interactions in their development, under realistic conditions, and (iv) science-based communication of a broader set of possible climate outcomes for the coming decades, in support of adaptation and risk mitigation.

The objective of this job is to contribute to the assessment of aerosol radiative effects and climate impacts using radiative transfer modelling combined with satellite remote sensing observations, supporting the evaluation of aerosol effective radiative forcing and associated impacts on precipitation and extreme events.

Location: FORTH/ICE-HT, Patras, Greece

Duration: up to 12 months, with the potential of renewal or extension according to the needs of the project and performance

Salary: up to approximately 1800 Euros per month, (total cost of the employer, including social security and taxes), depending on qualifications.

Envisaged starting date: 01/11/2026



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Requirements and Qualifications

The candidate is required to hold a Diploma in Environmental Engineering and a MSc in Chemical Engineering. The candidate should have been registered as a PhD Candidate. Moreover, candidates must be fluent in Greek language and have good knowledge of English (at least level B2) language.

Application Submission

In order to be considered, the application must include:

- Certificate of registration as a PhD candidate
- Copy of MSc thesis
- Copies of publications in international journals or conferences
- Employer's certificate and any other official documentation of the required experience

Any application received after the deadline will not be considered for the selection.

Selection Procedure

Applications that are received on time will be evaluated by a scientific committee using the criteria mentioned above. If necessary, certain candidates will be invited to a personal interview with the committee.

Interview Criteria:

(a) Background in the objective of the assignment (5 points). (b) Organizational and communication skills (5 points). (c) Team-spirit and self-motivation (5 points). (d) Commitment to achieving the goals (5 points)

The outcome of the selection will be announced on the website of FORTH/ICE-HT as well as on the website of "DIAVGEIA".
